A Message From the President...

Recently, there was an article on the Minnesota Hockey (our state governing body of hockey) website that went like this:

"Parents, did you know that there were 35,324 boys and 8,361 girls registered to play youth hockey in Minnesota last season? Did you know that there were about 6,200 boys & 3,900 girls playing High School hockey? Did you know that there were about 250 Minnesota boys and about 95 Minnesota girls on division one college hockey rosters? Did you know there were 20 Minnesota-born players in the NHL and that the first professional women's team in Minnesota began only this year? The chances of your son or daughter getting a division one college scholarship is minute. The chances of your son or daughter playing professional hockey are miniscule. While children can & should have dreams they, and you, should understand the long odds that exist. They, and you, should also understand the hours and years of hard work involved beyond scheduled practices and games in order to make those dreams come true."

This message should be clear to us all, but really brings reality to light. The reality is that for a player to earn a division one scholarship or make it to the NHL, it takes an enormous amount of work on the players' part. The bigger reality is that most, if not all, hockey associations are not structured to meet this need. The "need" is significantly more ice time, specialized training, etc. All of this requires time and money.

Frequently, parents ask what the association is doing for their child. The answer is simple: the association is providing a structured environment in which your child can participate in ice hockey. It's great if your son or daughter has the desire and a goal to play at a higher level in hockey.

Please remember that the Eastview Hockey Association is here to serve ALL of our participants, not just a select few. The positive experience our kids are having participating in ice hockey will be remembered for their lifetime and for yours. So, relax, enjoy the camaraderie, and have fun!!

Communication Requires Effort From All

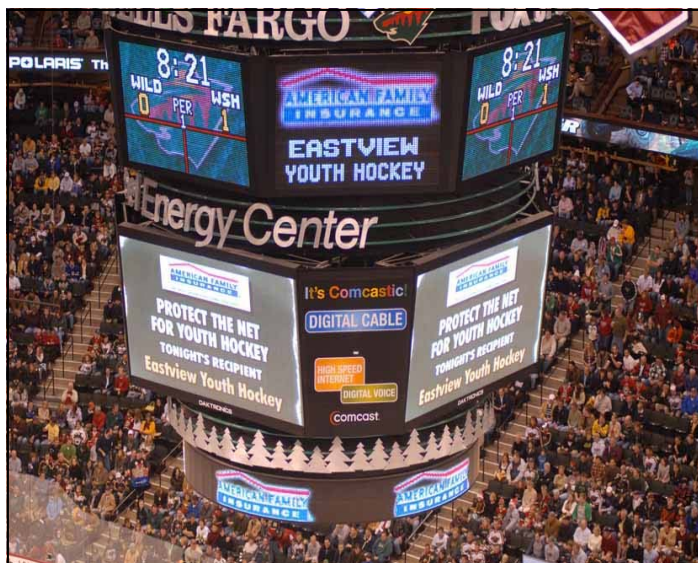

 - Look for a survey form later to give specific feedback on areas of the tryouts.

March 31	Season ends for all Squirt teams

The Mite schedule will be communicated following the Mite Evaluations on October 28, 2006, and the creation of the teams early November.
